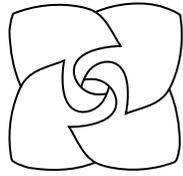
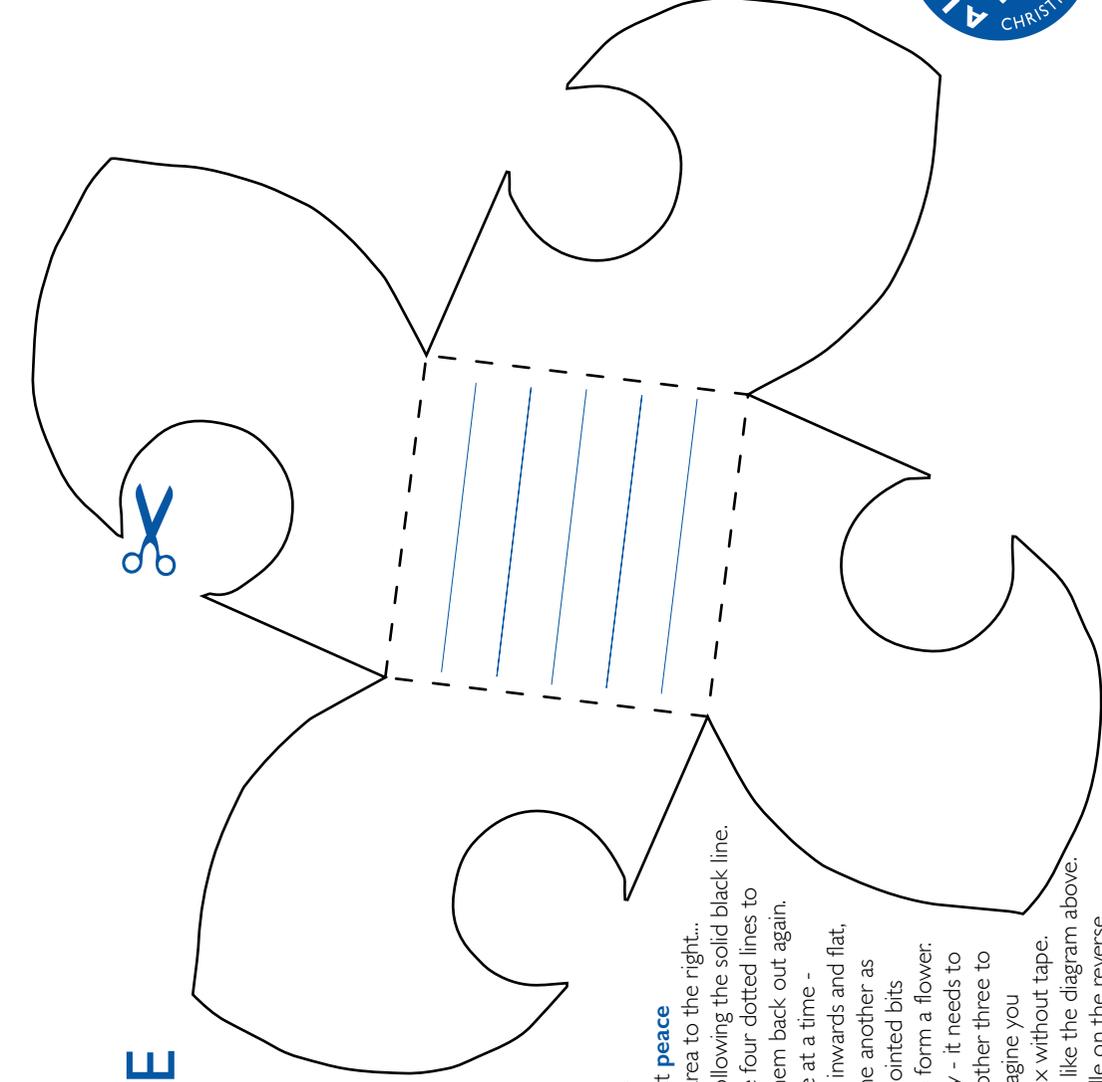


PETALS for PEACE

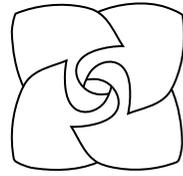


HOW TO MAKE YOUR PAPER FLOWER

1. Write a message about what **peace** means to you on the lined area to the right...
2. Cut out your template by following the solid black line.
3. Make inward folds along the four dotted lines to form each petal, then fold them back out again.
4. Working clockwise now, one at a time - carefully fold the four petals inwards and flat, tucking them underneath one another as you work. You'll notice the pointed bits secure the petals in place to form a flower.
Note: The fourth flap is tricky - it needs to be flapped underneath the other three to finalise your flower. **TIP:** Imagine you are securing a cardboard box without tape.
5. The finished flower will look like the diagram above.
